HUMANITIES: Please select from the following Humanities disciplines: Art, Communications, Dance, Design, English (except English Composition I & II), Graphic Design, International Studies, Media Studies, Languages, Music, Philosophy, and Photography. Selected courses from these disciplines will satisfy General Education requirement(s). ACS 103, Learning Techniques (3Cr) and ACS 111, Becoming a Master Student (1Cr) are also Humanities Electives.

SOCIAL SCIENCES: Please select from the following Social Science disciplines: Economics, History, Human Services, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology/Anthropology, Criminal Justice and Public Administration. Selected courses from these disciplines will satisfy General Education requirement(s).

SCIENCE ELECTIVE: Students may select from courses in Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Science.

FREE ELECTIVES: Any course or combination of courses totaling the required credits.

BUSINESS ELECTIVES: Select courses from the following: Accounting, Business, Marketing, CMP 205, 207 or Hospitality Management. BUS 224/225 Cooperative Work Experience and Related Class (available only with the approval of your advisor).

A student who has taken ECO 113 Elements of Economics may not take ECO 211 Principles of Economics I, without first consulting a faculty advisor. Elements of Economics does not serve as a prerequisite for Principles of Economics II.

HEALTH & WELLNESS: A student may complete the two-credit Health and Wellness requirement by enrolling in any Health Education (HED) course(s) that add up to at least two credits, any combination of one-credit Health/Exercise (HES) course(s), and/or selected course(s) in Dance (DAN).
